USE YOUR VOTE TO STOP A MILITANT- STYLE TAKEOVER

Wirral Council is on the verge of being taken over by the hard left, Militant-style Labour Party. When there was a Militant-led Council in Liverpool, investors were scared away, jobs were lost and taxes went up.

At this year's Council elections, there are just two seats in it. If Labour loses two seats, Wirral will have narrowly avoided going down the Liverpool 'road to ruin' that we saw in the 1980s.

Opinion polls show it's neck and neck between Labour and the local Conservatives.

THERE ARE JUST 2 SEATS IN IT!


The outcome of the Council election in Wirral will decide whether we have a Militant-style Labour Council after May 2nd.

The 'hard left' members who have joined since Jeremy Corbyn became Leader now control the Labour Party across Wirral. Following the decision of Council Leader Phil Davies to step down in May, it is likely that his replacement will be one of those councillors as well.

All that is stopping them from controlling the Council are the 21 Conservative Councillors in the Town Hall. The other parties are too far behind and can't win.

If Labour loses just two seats in these elections (out of the 35 they hold), they won't have outright control of the Council. (A Party needs 34 seats or more to run the Council on it's own.)

That means all the parties will have to work together and only policies that have the support of a majority of

councillors will be agreed. That's why every vote - including every postal vote - matters so much.

The last time Militant Labour ran a council it was in Liverpool, with Derek Hatton in the 1980s. Their extreme policies and tactics scared away investors, leading to job losses, higher taxes and

worse local services, as well as from a reputation that took years to recover.

No matter how you vote in a General Election, locally here in Wirral, it's different this time but it's going to be close. Just two seats will decide whether your Council goes down the Liverpool road to ruin after May 2nd.

YOUR POSTAL VOTE IS ON THE WAY: USE IT OR LOSE IT!

Postal votes are the safest way of voting but, at every election, some votes aren't counted because they have been sent back too late or haven't been completed properly.

This guide tells you what should be in the postal vote pack that has been sent to you by the Town Hall.


The step-by-step guide also tells you how to make sure it is done correctly. Remember, you don't need a stamp to post it back. You can send it back using your nearest post box.

If you make a mistake or if you're not sure what to do, call the Postal Vote Helpline at the Town Hall on 0151 691 8046 or electoral@wirral.gov.uk and the staff there will do their best to help.

Please remember that, at every election, there are seats that are won or lost by a handful of votes.

Don't wake up on Friday 3rd May to find that you have a Labour Councillor - and a Militant Labour Council - make sure you use your postal vote to keep Steve Williams working in Moreton and Saughall Massie.

WHAT YOU WILL GET FROM YOUR COUNCIL



A STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE TO COMPLETING YOUR POSTAL VOTE

STEP 1

Fill in the ballot paper and put into the envelope marked "A". Now seal the envelope marked "A".




STEP 2

Sign your postal voting statement and give your date of birth, both of which will be checked against the Postal Vote Register.



STEP 3

Put the Postal Voting Statement and the sealed envelope marked "A" into the envelope marked "B" and ensure the address shows through the window.



STEP 4

Post it! No stamp necessary.

WIRRAL'S LABOUR COUNCIL IS SPENDING MORE ON CONSULTANTS AND SENIOR DIRECTORS:

Council chiefs in the money

A damning report by the independent Taxpayers' Alliance has named Wirral as paying higher salaries for senior directors than almost any other council in the country.

Their recent report ('Town Hall Rich List') revealed that Wirral's top seven directors had cost the taxpayer £1.4 million a year.

At the same time, Labour's use of private sector management consultants to support the Directors and the 10 member Labour Cabinet continues to grow - one individual is being paid £900 a DAY!.

To put this into context, it's the equivalent of fixing every faulty street light in Wallasey.

So, the next time Wirral Labour puts a leaflet through your letterbox or knocks on your door to tell you there is 'no money', ask them why they are spending YOUR money on these top jobs. It's their political choice to do so.

Councillor Steve Williams and the local Conservatives have a plan to deal with this:

- 1. STOP** recruiting Directors who are paid more than the Prime Minister.
- 2. PUBLISH** the cost of the top jobs and consultants with the annual Council Tax bill.
- 3. REDUCE** the use of outside consultants and make their appointments public.
- 4. CAP** the generous pay-offs when senior directors retire or leave the Council.

If you agree with our plan, use your postal vote to vote for it at the council elections this year:

The top 3 mistakes made by postal voters:

1 TOO LATE: Don't leave it until the last minute to post it. Most people return theirs immediately to make sure.

2 NOT SIGNED: If you don't sign the Declaration that is with the ballot paper, your vote won't be counted.

3 SPOILT BALLOT: Don't put your name on the ballot paper and only mark one box on it otherwise it won't count.



LOCAL ACTION FOR MORETON AND SAUGHALL MASSIE

Labour pops up at election time while the smaller parties don't even bother then! Only the local Conservatives led by Steve Williams, Chris Blakeley and Bruce Berry keep in touch all year round. We can't promise to solve every problem, but we will try our best.



Lifesaving defibrillators:

Working with the Constituency Committee, Steve secured the cash for lifesaving 'defibs' to be installed, including at Deborah's on Town Meadow Lane.



Dodd's Builder's Yard:

Neighbours living nearby are concerned that a plan for 15 houses on the site may be approved. Steve is working with them for a better scheme.



Green Belt:

Labour voted to build the fire station on Green Belt at Saughall Massie. Now, Steve is working to save the nearby historic Diamond Farm.



Girtrell Court:

Steve, Chris and Bruce worked with campaigners to try to save the facility and worked with residents who were unhappy with the size of the proposed building to replace it.



The Dog Ban Plan:

Steve joined the protest walk against Labour's plan which seeks to ban dogs from parts of our Borough while doing nothing about dog fouling in residential areas, shops or near schools.



Lingham estate:

Last year, we promised action and we delivered. Steve arranged for overgrown hedges (such as here in Berrylands Road) to be tidied up and a community clean up was held.
