

TOWN HALL DIRECTORS COST £1.4 MILLION!

Furious backlash from voters but 'no comment' from Labour

A report in the Wirral Globe (*'Council Chiefs in the Money'*, 10 April 2019) revealed that a Town Hall director had cost the 'cash strapped' Labour Council a staggering £569,423.

The top seven directors, in total, cost the Council £1.4 million a year, four of whom are listed here.

The costs were revealed by the Taxpayers' Alliance and put Wirral as the second highest paying council in the whole country.

Wirral's Conservative Councillors voted against the payments but were outvoted by Labour Councillors, using their slim

majority to push it through.

Residents, who have been told that there was no money for repairs to street lights and pot holes or maintenance of trees and grass verges, have spoken of their outrage at the payments.

In their four page advert last week, Labour made no reference to the payments but, once again, complained they had 'no money'.
