DID YOU KNOW?

1 In 2018, local Conservative councillors in this constituency submitted an average of 108 problems and issues for action by the Town Hall. Labour Councillors submitted an average of just 34. That means areas with local Conservative Councillors get a better service for the money they pay in Council Tax.

2 Debbie Caplin is visible in our community and works hard on the local issues that people raise with her. In the five years since Ian Lewis lost, our area has had four different Labour Councillors, now they want people to vote for a fifth!

3 This election is about who runs our local services, who gets our pot holes repaired, our bins emptied and street lights fixed. On 2nd May, the choice is between yet another Labour candidate who has popped up at election time or Debbie Caplin.
