## DID YOU KNOW?

**1** In 2018, Councillors Paul Hayes, Ian Lewis and Lesley Rennie raised 419 issues and problems for action in our area. In neighbouring New Brighton, the three Labour councillors raised just 130 over the same period.

**2** Paul, Ian and Lesley are among the highest attendance records in the Town Hall and are visible in our community. When this area was represented by a Labour councillor, she was hardly ever seen and rarely spoke up for residents.

**3** Unlike Labour Councillors, Paul, Ian and Lesley do not claim expenses for things like travel, meals or subsistence. And, unlike Labour, they don't use the money you pay in Council Tax to employ consultants or spin doctors.

Now, in Wirral, the same thing is about to happen here.


There are many traditional Labour voters who are appalled at what their party has become.
