Today, I have been in a text discussion with the Director of Regeneration, Alan Evans, following our request for myself and Councillors Lesley Rennie and Paul Hayes to meet with him and the Council's Chief Executive, Paul Satoor.

Alan Evans has agreed that no decisions will be taken until we meet with him, sometime this week. I have also made both Alan and Paul Satoor aware of our views regarding the proposed cycle lane.

It is unacceptable that we (you and your local councillors) were not consulted over the route or the detailed plans as published.


We have also received emails from people in Liscard, Seacombe and New Brighton wards who were not aware of the plans (or today's deadline for the consultation).
