Annual Survey 2025: the results so far

Your local councillors Colin Baldwin, Gary Bennett and Vida Wilson report back...

Do you support a new train station?

From the responses we've received so far, most people support the idea of a new station between Moreton and Meols or would like to know more.

The idea isn't new - it was first proposed in the late 1990s. Merseytravel even bought the land needed for a new station.

Former Councillor Chris Blakeley raised the issue again with Merseytravel in the late 2000's. They agreed it was viable.

To encourage as many people as possible to use the new station, Merseytravel

asked Wirral Council to agree to install a footbridge over the Arrowe Brook, near the railway.

And that's when plans stalled.

The Council said they couldn't afford to install the bridge.

Then, the Metro Mayor was elected and his plans didn't include a new station for our area.

Instead, a derelict station at Baltic in Liverpool would re-open, costing £100m.

Three new stations were also announced for Daresbury (Halton); Carr Mill (St Helens) and Woodchurch.

If a clear majority of people who take part in our current survey support a new station, we'll then meet with a member of the City Region's Transport Committee (which took over from Merseytravel) to find the next steps.

These are some of the local issues raised so far..



1 We have reported the latest load of rubbish fly tipped at the top of Carr Lane, near the crossing for action. In spite of the higher fines, the problem continues.



2 Broken glass in Linear Park was cleared by a resident. The Council phone number on the sign is no longer in use. We've asked for the new number!



3 We've asked for more action on weeds on pavements, including Town Meadow Lane. A £235,000 contract was signed in May to better tackle weeds in the Borough.



4 Residents asked for the junction markings at Garrick Avenue to be repainted. We've reported this to the Highways Department and await their response!



6 The litter bin at Berwick Close and Carr Lane is frequently overflowing. We have asked the Council for a bigger bin to take the mostly bagged dog waste.



7 Residents living around the Rake Hey green space have complained it is now just a mess. The Council's 'rewilding' plan has failed. We've asked for it to be cleaned up.



8 It might be one of the longest residential roads in the Borough, but Millhouse Lane has no road sign at the junction with Hoylake Road. We've asked for one!



9 Two residents told us about the overgrown footpath from Broster Avenue to Bermuda Road. We've reported that and also asked for the street light to be repaired.
